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

On Campus Experience (OCE) Scholarship

Sunday 5th - Thursday 9th May 2019
Sunday 9th - Thursday 13th June 2019

Closing date for applications: Friday 15th March 2019

The On Campus Experience (OCE) is a fully funded scholarship that provides an amazing opportunity for senior secondary students of Māori descent to experience learning at the University of Otago. The scholarship covers flight costs, accommodation at a residential college, food, programme activities and light entertainment. Students will be selected to participate in one of the two OCE scholarship programmes offered in 2019.

Students will explore the Otago campus and the student city of Dunedin. They will also have the opportunity to attend lectures in their areas of interest as well as meet academic staff and students.

The OCE allows students to experience life in a residential college and meet the Māori Centre staff who provide great support for Māori students when they come to Otago. All successful recipients of the OCE scholarship will travel to Dunedin on one of the two programme dates.

Entries are sought from Year 13 students of Māori descent, who are currently enrolled in a New Zealand secondary school, and considering studying at the University of Otago in 2020. All applicants should be students who are completing their final year of secondary schooling, and are likely to gain University Entrance.

ELIGIBILITY

- Applicants must be New Zealand citizens or permanent residents, of Māori descent
- Applicants must also be students who are attending and completing their final year of secondary schooling

DOC's DILEMMA: balancing biodiversity and visitors.

The Department of Conservation manages almost one third of New Zealand's land area, including some of our most visited spots and iconic scenery. Legally, it is required to protect fragile ecosystems and threatened species AND manage the ever-increasing demands for visitor access to them.

Its budget is split roughly 50:50 between these conservation and visitor management roles. Criticism – often trenchant and emotional – comes from both sides of this divide.

In this Catalyst Conversation, DOC's director-general Lou Sanson will look at the issues, ways forward and how the community can help.

Lou Sanson has headed DOC since September 2013, after 11 years as chief executive of Antarctica New Zealand. In this latter role, he oversaw the deepest ever multi-national sedimentary science drilling project in Antarctica (ANDRILL) and led the development of Antarctica's largest wind turbine project to reduce fossil fuel use at McMurdo Station and Scott Base.

Prior to this, he was DOC's Southland Conservator, in charge of Fiordland National Park and Stewart Island. During this time, he led the establishment of Rakiura National Park, the sub-Antarctic World Heritage Area, one of the world's largest island pest eradication projects and helped establish the southern network of marine reserves.

WASTE MINIMISATION COMMUNITY FUND

*“Towards zero waste and
a sustainable district”*

\$50,000 is available to support community-driven waste minimisation activities throughout the Queenstown Lakes District.



WHAT IS THE FUND?

The Waste Minimisation Community Fund is an initiative of Queenstown Lakes District Council's **WASTE MINIMISATION AND MANAGEMENT PLAN 2018** (WMMP).

The Council has up to \$50,000 available in 2018/19 to help support community-driven waste minimisation initiatives. The fund provides for initiatives that minimise waste, maximise resource recovery and support the WMMP vision and objectives.

WHO CAN APPLY?

The fund is open to community groups, businesses, iwi/Māori organisations, educational institutions and other community-based organisations operating in the Queenstown Lakes district.

WHAT CAN THE FUNDING BE USED FOR?

THE FUNDING CAN BE USED FOR:

- ✓ Feasibility studies and business cases
- ✓ Materials and equipment
- ✓ Skills development
- ✓ Trials and pilot programmes
- ✓ Education programmes
- ✓ Learning opportunities
- ✓ Workshops, events, monitoring and surveys
- ✓ Research and development (that is not aimed at supporting the attainment of a qualification)
- ✓ Project execution or implementation costs
- ✓ Funding can be used for operational or capital expenditure that is required to undertake a project.

THE FUNDING CANNOT BE USED FOR:

- ✗ Projects that are inconsistent with QLDC's Waste Minimisation and Management Plan
- ✗ Projects that involve waste generated from outside of the Queenstown Lakes district
- ✗ Projects focused on waste disposal, the treatment of waste or litter clean ups
- ✗ Retrospective projects where the funding sought is for work already completed
- ✗ Debt servicing
- ✗ Activities which duplicate other projects
- ✗ Pilot studies
