## NCEA Schedule

### Tutorial Week

Begins on Friday 2nd November and goes through to Tuesday 6th November, with exams starting on Wednesday 7th November in the theatre. Senior students are welcome to attend school during tutorial week, but only for study. The following study spaces will be available to students throughout tutorial week and exams; Shotover (Maths/HPE), O Te Rotu (Languages) and the Library. Students at school must be studying during 'normal class times' and using the normal school breaks, otherwise they must be offsite.

### Exam Admission Slip

For an official transcript of results, students will need to order their Record of Achievement (ROA).

In Ako time on the morning of 24th October, each student received their Exam Admission Slips and external exam information sheets.

This is their entry ticket into the exam room (with student ID). Students are reminded not to write on this. Digital English candidates will have their passwords on the sheet. External standards cannot be removed at this stage, but if you have an external standard missing students should speak with Mr Richards ASAP.

If students miss an exam due to sickness or an incident beyond their control, they should get a medical certificate or contact Mr Richards to start the Derived Grade process.

If students choose not to attend an exam session they need to contact the school to avoid a phone call home.

### NCEA Results

At any stage of the year, students can log in via the Learner login and view the results that NZQA holds for them. They will need their NSN number and to make their own password (if you forget this, email or phone NZQA). If they haven't already done so, we ask all students to login to NZQA during Ako time before exams to ensure they can access the information required.

In January, students can access a Results Notice which provides results for internal and external assessment from the previous year.

Students also have the right to request:

A review (if a processing error has occurred)

A reconsideration (if they believe an error in marking has occurred)

A change of address (for return of exam papers)

### Just Short of a Major Qualification

In years past, when possible, we have endeavoured to support students who have fallen just short of a 'major qualification'. Students who fall just short of UE, Level 2 and Level 2 endorsed with Excellence may be eligible for support in the following academic year, provided they meet the following requirements: Within 4 credits and 1 standard of achieving a 'significant' qualification and have had satisfactory attendance and work ethic. Please note that this is not always a possibility as standards and/or teachers may not be available to support this, so please don't fall short.

If you have any questions, comments or concerns please let Mr Richards or myself know.

## Junior Exams



## Central Lakes Trust Scholarships

Fifty students from 8 secondary schools were presented Central Lakes Trust tertiary education scholarships at the official awards function held in Cromwell. The scholarships, which are valued at \$2,500 each, aim to assist students who study at a tertiary institution.

"We're very pleased to have found a way to support young people build their futures. In the 12 years this programme has been running we've helped 434 young people, to a total amount of \$1,051,500," said Chief Executive, Susan Finlay.

Eligibility for these scholarships requires applicants to be between 16 and 19 years of age and have lived in the Central Lakes Trust region and meet the eligibility criteria. The selection criteria considers various factors including the applicant's academic record, all-round qualities and achievements.


## End of Year Student Folio Art Exhibition
