Ako buddy for a new student	1	once per term	You can choose to support a new student by helping them settle in, showing them around, and answering their questions. When a new student arrives, you can then be assigned to support them in this space. Write a description of how you supported the new student and submit this as evidence. Competed in House Debating	1	Once per year	House Debating is a great way to showcase your skills while earning points. Completed Google Drive digital literacy	1	once per year	You must complete the Google Drive Unit, demonstrating your ability to organize and manage your files effectively. Once your kaiārahi has checked your work and confirmed that it meets expectations, they will ask you to submit evidence. Consistently used Te reo me ona tikanga Māori during Ako time	1	once per term	To achieve this goal, you will need to consistently use Te Reo Māori in Ako time with your Ako teacher. This includes incorporating greetings, farewells, common phrases, and tikanga-based practices in your interactions. Additionally, you must lead at least one karakia in Ako. Your kaiārahi will observe and verify your efforts. Evidence submitted should include a written description of your interactions and a transcript of the karakia you lead. Created a non-targeted CV	1	once per year	To complete this goal, you must be issued the CV task by your kaiārahi. This is an online task that teaches you how to create a general, non-targeted CV that can be adapted for different job applications. With support from your kaiārahi, you will complete your CV. 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Created a 'Next Steps' learning journey presentation to share with parents	3	once per term	Kaiārahi Next Steps is a chance for your kaiārahi, your family, and you to talk about your awesome learning throughout the term. You can be proactive in this space by creating your own personal learning journey slideshow. This should outline the highlights of your learning, areas you think you need to improve, and what you're excited for next. To earn points, you must work on your presentation during Ako time and present it at Kaiārahi Next Steps. Submit your presentation as evidence.	Student evidence submission form / Kaiārahi approval
Created a targeted CV for a specified job	1	once per year	To complete this goal, you must be issued the CV task by your kaiārahi. This is an online task that teaches you how to create a targeted CV tailored for a specific job application. With support from your kaiārahi, you will create your targeted CV. Once finished, your kaiārahi will review and mark it. If it meets the required standard, they will advise you to submit it as evidence.	Student evidence submission form / Kaiārahi approval
Day of service during a non-school day	3	once per term	You can dedicate a FULL day to volunteering in the community or for a charity project outside of school hours to earn points. There are many local and New Zealand charities or groups you could support, such as Baskets of Blessing, a local hospice, Happiness House, or the Tuckers Beach Clean-Up. Delivered personal pepeha to a small group	3	once per year	Sharing your pepeha helps build confidence and strengthens connections with others. To earn points, you must share your pepeha in a small group setting. This could be during Ako time or another appropriate opportunity. Gained skills in a second language	1	once per semester	To achieve this goal, you will need to learn and practice a language that is not your own. To demonstrate your progress, you must record a video of a conversation between you and another person in the new language. Your conversation should include the following:  Greet someone – "Hello, how are you?" Ask about their day – "How is your day going?" Give encouragement – "You are doing a great job." Once you have completed a full term of lessons, submit your evidence. 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Prepare a meal for the household	1	once per term	Plan and prepare a meal for everyone at home. Take responsibility for choosing the food, cooking it safely, and helping with clean-up. Evidence should include photos and the recipe or a list of ingredients used. Produced and presented art work outside class	1	once per term	To achieve this goal, you must complete an art project outside of class and provide evidence of your work. Public performance (inc. science busking)	1	once per semester	When you take part in a cultural or public performance, such as playing in a school band, participating in a drama production, or science busking, you can earn points. If this is a school-organized group, you need to ask your group leader to ensure you have been entered into the school system. For each event you perform at, your group leader can then assign you points. If it is not a school organised group, collect and submit evidence (e.g. photos or a written description). Read a graphic novel	1	once per term	To achieve this goal, you will need to read a graphic novel of your choice. To be awarded points, you must explain the plot of the book and discuss why you liked or disliked it, and submit this written description as evidence. Read a non-fiction book	1	once per term	To achieve this goal, you will need to read a non-fiction book of your choice. Read a novel	1	once per term	To achieve this goal, you will need to read a novel of your choice. To be awarded points, you must explain the plot of the book and discuss why you liked or disliked it, and submit this written description as evidence. Referee for a school/community sport	1	once per term	If you apply through the sports department to train as a referee and officiate at a school sports event or league, ensuring fair play and applying the rules correctly, you will be awarded points. Student volunteer army	3	once per semester	The Student Volunteer Army (SVA) is an external agency that you can sign up to. Through the SVA, you can take part in a range of positive actions for the wider community, such as a community clean-up or charity project. Used a self management tool for at least 1 term	3	once per semester	Developing self-management skills is an important part of your learning journey. Actively contribute in peer mentor community day	1	Once per year	When you take part in a Peer Mentor Community Day, you will automatically be assigned points. Gained a distinction in one subject	3	any frequency	This goal is managed by the school. If you place in the top 5% of your cohort in a subject, you will be awarded a Distinction and earn 3 points towards your passport. Participate in an extra or co-curricular activity over a semester	3	once per semester	Every time you sign up for an extra or co-curricular activity, it is recorded in the school system, and you are added to a group.
