#### **Principal's Message**

Kia ora - welcome to the end of the first week at WHS. As I said last week, our focus this week was settling to teaching and learning. Along with other senior leaders I have walked around the school a bit this week and it is great to see that we have settled well and are well and truly underway. Overall it has been a good start to the 2020 year.

You may have seen on our Facebook page that we had our first whole school assembly of the year this morning. It was great to come together as a school, and a key part of that was to acknowledge students' achievements in NCEA last year - more on that below.

2019 Results continued - following on from my piece last week about how well our students achieved last year are the Scholarship results which came out on Wednesday. Scholarships are the pinnacle of academic achievement, and to gain a Scholarship is a great achievement and honour. Sitting scholarship is optional and undertaken by our top scholars, who work hard with their teachers - often before and/or after school, throughout the year to prepare for them. We have just found out that our students have achieved 21 Scholarships last year (and we are confident of at least one more), including two Outstanding Scholarships. This is a fantastic achievement and our congratulations and our thanks go to those students and their teachers who are listed below. Special congratulations to our 2019 Dux, Garth Harcombe, who achieved four scholarships, and to Hylton Briscoe and Bonny Turton who achieved Outstanding scholarships.

When you consider these great Scholarship results, our fantastic general results from last week as well as the \$500,000 worth of tertiary scholarships that our Year 13 students gained last year you can see that we really are delivering a great education for our students at WHS. As I said at the assembly this morning, as a school we work very hard to support our students to achieve and I do want to acknowledge all the work and effort from the school and staff - from the great teaching, to all the tracking and monitoring, and individual mentoring that we do to support our students to achieve.

#### Buses

Students should now have their allocated bus route/s printed onto the student's ID cards. A reminder, the Ministry only provides the service to get from home to school and back again, so students must only travel on the route allocated to them. They cannot travel on other buses to get to sport, friends' houses, work, etc as there is simply no capacity to carry them and buses end up overloaded.

Students have also read through the expectations for their behaviour on buses. Students can be stood down from using the buses either temporarily or permanently if they do not adhere to these expectations.

As with each year, there is a settling period with the school buses and some adjustments may be made in the first few weeks as GoBus work through the numbers on each route; we will communicate any changes with you.

#### **Purchasing Food at the School Cafe**

Did you know you can pre-pay and load money on your student's Student ID card for purchasing food at the school cafe?! You can eliminate the need to send your student with cash, or having to put money in a bank account that could then be used anywhere for anything.

To load money onto their Student ID card, you can pay at school via cash/efpos etc or pay online (reference is the Student ID number on their ID card and "cafe" eg 15632 cafe). If you have questions please email office@wakatipu.school.nz.

#### WHS App

The WHS app is recommended for both student and parents, particularily new parents. This is how we communicate our most urgent and important notifications and reminders.

It's free to download and use for iOS and Android devices.


#### **Extra Curricular Expo**




