Principal's Message

Kia ora and welcome to the Wakatipu High School newsletter at the end of our first full week of teaching and learning. It has been a good week, as I said last week the school has settled well. We are unfortunately experiencing some wifi issues, particularly with Macs, that are frustrating for staff and students and we are working hard to resolve them.

It was great to see such a turnout of Year 9 parents at the Greenstone Camp evening on Wednesday night - good on all those parents who came along for info on this important camp. For those whose students have already been on the camp a point to note this year is that we are running five camps in House groups. As we grow as a school the Houses will become increasingly important to students' sense of belonging in the school and this is another step to support that.

You may have seen on our Facebook page that we had three students complete the Coast to Coast last weekend - an incredible achievement. Congratulations to Sam Davis, Linus Ritchie and Jess MacDonald; see the [sports section](#) for a photo of them.

Foyer - as I noted previously, if you've been into our foyer this year you will have seen that we have added a number of elements to the foyer to make it better represent WHS and who we are and what is important to us. These include our motto, values, annual school goals, House competition standings, Class Act recipients, Year 13 ties and an art display. While it has taken some time to get all the elements in place, and some are still works in progress (eg the annual goals, which we update by the end of February each year after we have reviewed the previous year's results) we have had really positive feedback and are very pleased with what it contributes to our school and our culture.

A very important part of the process was to develop and include a cultural element. We begun this process by engaging with our Rūnaka, Ōraka-Aparima. They were supportive and connected us with Maui design studio, whose employees were ex-WHS students - a wonderful and important connection for the work. They met with us to identify what was important and have designed a cultural pattern and graphical representations of our values. In terms of cultural elements, also in the foyer area now is a painting of Haki te kura, which was donated by BoT member Mr Rajeev Sunder. Haki te kura is a very important person in our local history and below the painting is an explanation of her story and the landmarks which are named after her.

Parent Tours - as we did last year, from Wednesday 4 March for five weeks we are going to offer parents an opportunity to come and have a look at teaching and learning in our school. The tours, which will be hosted by me and/or another member of the senior leadership team, will start at 9.30am for 60mins and will be limited to a maximum of 10 parents. NCEA Assessment Calendars

Students have recently been asked to set goals for 2020, pertaining to their academic achievement, learning dispositions and extra-curricular involvement. Term Calendar

The Portal

This app enables students (and parents) to view students academic results, feedback and feed-forward comments for next steps for learning, as well as attendance, Learning Engagement Reports and much more. All parents/caregivers were emailed their login and password last week and if you haven't yet accessed the Portal, we highly recommend that you do.

Assessments at WHS

Return of external assessment material

All NCEA material, including DVC reports and Technology portfolios, should have been returned to students or schools by mid-February. Please contact Mr Richards as soon as possible if material is missing, so that we can endeavour to locate this. Scholarship booklets will be returned once results have been released.

Students who participated in the digital externals can access their marked work until 30 June. They will need to use their digital exam login. If this has been forgotten, they should phone 0800 697 296.

Review and Reconsideration applications for 2019 external exam results:

It is advisable for students to talk to their teachers prior to applying for a review or reconsideration.

The original answer booklet must accompany any application for a review or reconsideration except for digital exams and digitally submitted Technology standards.

New Closing dates for Review and Reconsideration applications

The closing date for Applications for Review and Reconsiderations for all NCEA externally assessed standards has changed from 19 February and is now 21 February. The closing date for Scholarship remains the same; 6 March.

Cut scores

Cut scores have been released and may be found at the relevant subject link [here](#). These scores may assist students in their decision about whether to request a Review or Reconsideration.

Review application process

In a Review, all sections of a booklet or portfolio are checked to make sure they have been marked and results correctly recorded and transferred. A review does not involve re-marking and there is no charge.

Students should print off a copy of the personalised Review form from their Learner Login.

Reconsideration application process

A Reconsideration involves re-marking all answers in the answer booklet and checking mechanical processes (such as transferring grades).

NCEA Reconsiderations cost \$20.40 for each standard. The fee for Design and Visual Communication (DVC) and Technology portfolios is \$20.40 for each external achievement standard, not each portfolio.

The fee for Scholarship Reconsiderations is \$30.70 per standard (subject).

NZQA will waive the fee for students meeting income criteria who wish to apply for a reconsideration of an NCEA or Scholarship result. Details can be found in this [circular](#).

Where the Reconsideration leads to a grade change, the fee is refunded.

Students must apply for Reconsideration through their Learner Login. Payment should also be made online.

Reconsideration applications for Level 3 and New Zealand Scholarship Visual Arts

These can also be completed from the Learner Login.

High-quality A4 coloured photographs and an authenticity declaration must be posted to NZQA. Scholarship applications must include both photographs and workbook. No portfolios are to be sent to NZQA.

Ākonga Passport

The Ākonga Passport is a system of positive acknowledgement for students in Years 9 & 10 that aligns with our Ākonga (Learner) Profile.

The Ākonga Passport will acknowledge students in the following areas:

- Behaviours that exemplify the School Values (values card system)
- LE (Learning Engagement, 3-weekly) Reports
- Participation in extra & co-curricular activities
- Service to others - both within and outside of school
- Digital Certificate (Year 9) & Careers Certificate (Year 10)

Each section has points which students accumulate in their Passports. They strive to gain as many points as possible throughout the year, aiming for the different levels of the Passport

Bronze (15 points)

Silver (30 points)

Gold (50 points)

Students reaching the required thresholds will be presented with the relevant 'Peak' during the year at our Excellence/Ad Alta Assemblies and a badge to wear on their blazer.
