Principal's Message

Kia ora - welcome to the Wakatipu High School newsletter at the end of Week 4. In general it has been a great week at WHS. It was good to have our Pounamu Assemblies to acknowledge senior students who achieved highly in NCEA in 2019. It was great to have parents come along and support, good on you.

Another highlight of the week was the Extracurricular Expo on Tuesday. It was awesome to see so many students in the gym and theatre and signing up for activities. We do believe that sport, arts, culture, community and leadership opportunities are not only great fun but are an important medium for students to learn about themselves and others and grow holistically, and hence are a critical part of our all-round education. Do speak with your student to see what they were interested in and have signed up for.

This week we heard that we now have 79% of last year's Year 13s have achieved University Entrance - a fantastic result for those students and the school, and also that Bonny Koehn-Turton was awarded our 22nd Scholarship, for Design (as we expected she would be). It was actually Bonny's third Scholarship, and NZQA particularly noted how rare it is for a student to achieve three visual arts scholarships (and what great teaching and mentoring she must have had) - a tremendous achievement by Bonny!

Regarding student achievement some of you will have read in the Mountain Scene or heard me say at the Pounamu Assemblies about our results and levels of achievement. The short version is that, for our key measures of NCEA Level 2 and UE, when the national data becomes available next

month we expect that we will be in the top 5% or so of state secondary schools in the country. We think it is worth people hearing this as we're not sure if people realise what a great education WHS is providing.

In terms of amazing achievement it was also fantastic to see ex-student Alice Robinson win another World Cup GS last weekend, as well as win the Emerging Talent Award at the Halbergs the previous week, and achieve her UE!

A not so good part of the week was an incident yesterday morning some of you may be aware of, in which an out-of-town youth assaulted one of our students which then escalated into a brief fight. While this took place before school and at Remarkables Park, this is not what we want for our students or the school.

Donations - it is the time of year when we send out our invoices for our general school donations. School fees and donations have had quite a lot of media coverage in recent months - particularly with the Government's work in this area. Some points to note re this: as a Decile 10 school we receive the lowest amount of Government funding; also as a Decile 10, we are not eligible for the new scheme whereby we can take Government funding in lieu of asking for donations etc; as directed, we have removed all compulsory course fees (but we are still asking for donations for many subjects - but NB these are voluntary, and tax deductible).

While our general 'school donation' is also voluntary, and tax deductible, it is a very important source of income for us which enables us to provide the great all-round education that we want

for our students, and we would ask that you please pay it if you are able. Related, and as I have noted in the past, we do welcome anyone who feels that they are able to add an extra amount to their donation to please do so.

Paid Union Meeting - a reminder that there is a PUM next Wednesday 26th February and that school will close at 1.50pm. Buses will run as usual except for the Lake Hayes buses (9211) which will run at 2pm and 2.30pm, and the Glenorchy bus (9209) which will run at 2pm. An email re this will be sent out on Monday.

NCEA Assessment - a reminder re the important section on assessment at WHS below, including our Assessment Policy and Calendars. A reminder also that our NCEA Parent information evening is next Tues - especially important for parents new to NCEA.

Parent Tours - a reminder that from Wednesday 4 March we are going to offer parents an opportunity to come and have a look at teaching and learning in our school. The tours start at 9.30am for 60mins and will be limited to a maximum of 10 parents. Please book by emailing my PA, Karla Dawson to book.

Another good week comes to a close, with a big week to follow with Participation Day next Friday. Again, lots of great info in the newsletter below. Another weekend of two halves weather-wise-showers and cool tomorrow but much better on Sunday:)




