Principal's Message

Kia ora and welcome to the Wakatipu High School newsletter at the end of a good week. The Year 9 Greenstone camps have come and gone in the last seven days with Arthur, Duncan and Fox all having gone well, while Hay headed out today and Mackenzie lucky last on Sunday.

We held a whole school assembly in Te Kiriri on Wednesday where I delivered a fine message about our expectations of behaviour via a story about a battleship and a lighthouse, we presented our prefects with their badges, and the Participation Day results were announced - congratulations to Duncan and Mackenzie Houses!

Some important items below from me this week.

Coronavirus

As everyone is aware, the situation regarding coronavirus is dynamic and challenging. We are constantly monitoring the situation, and receiving regular updates from the Ministry of Education. We are also looking ahead to ensure that we are considering and prepared for the range of possibilities as this situation evolves.

At this time we do wish to inform you of the following:

<u>School Trips Overseas -</u> an inbound group of Japanese exchange students who were scheduled to arrive at WHS next week are not coming. We have four other school trips currently scheduled to travel overseas this year and we will work with each trip to decide the best course of action. <u>Overseas Travel -</u> families planning or considering overseas travel with students, including in the upcoming April and July holidays, need to be aware of actual or potential issues, including:

- Anyone who has travelled through China, South Korea, Italy, Iran and/or Japan are required to remain in self-isolation for two weeks before returning to school. Families should monitor the Ministry of Health and SafeTravel websites for information and updates to this list.
- Anyone who has travelled anywhere overseas (including Australia) may be required to observe a two-week self-isolation period on their return to New Zealand. Please note that while this is not our current position we are aware that other schools are flagging this, and want to give people a heads up that it may be a possibility. People who travel also need to be aware of the potential implications of travel bans and isolation requirements changing while they are away.
- We would like families who are planning overseas travel with students to please register details of their travel with the school.
- In the event that students are in isolation our digital pedagogy supports remote learning well, and Te Kura (The Correspondence School) is offering online learning to support students.

<u>General Precautions -</u> as has been made clear by authorities, we all have a responsibility to follow good hygiene and safe practises including:

- Do not come to school if you are unwell.
- Hand hygiene is very important.
- · Cough or sneeze into the crook of your elbow.

As above, we will continue to monitor the situation as it continues to evolve and update you as appropriate. We do want people to be responsible, and also to be calm and considerate of others.

Phase 2

You may have seen the article in the Mountain Scene or ODT re Phase 2. While I referred to this in a newsletter at the start of the year, we have been waiting patiently for dates and details to be able to share with you. The expansion of the school from its current capacity of 1200 to 1800 has always been part of the master plan for the school, and we have been pushing to get this done as we have continued to grow. In addition to the new wings which will be added to the east and the expansion of the gym, there are modifications to the current building which mean that we will have to move into temporary classrooms during some periods of the construction phase - but exactly how much and when are yet to be determined. While we understand the contractors will be onsite from next term, we expect the work impacting parts of this building will be next year. We are in ongoing contact with the MoE re the project and are expecting to have updates to share with you in April.

Careers Expo - is an important and great initiative which is on next Thursday 12th. Please see below for more info and how to access this opportunity.

Before School - Please see below for a piece re students' movements and behaviour before school. Please do talk to your student about this. Thanks in anticipation of your support.

Uniform - as flagged last week, February is now behind us and blazers and ties are compulsory uniform items for all students every day.

NCEA Change Package

In case you missed it, the Government has been running a process to review NCEA Level 1, and has recently confirmed its final proposed NCEA change package. Schools have been advised that the changes are intended to: strengthen our national qualification; address over-assessment and fragmented learning; promote culturally responsive teaching and learning; and improve accessibility, the support available to teachers, and the information available to students and whānau.

A copy of the Ministry of Education's announcement is available here: Ministry website.

There are changes to the subjects that the Ministry proposes to support at NCEA Level 1. This is consistent with the policy objective - for NCEA Level 1 to become a broader, foundational qualification that allows students to keep their pathway options open, while Levels 2 and 3 promote greater specialisation.

The Ministry has asked me to encourage you all to give feedback. Public engagement on the subject list for NCEA Level 1 has commenced for a period of two months (closing on 20 April 2020).

More information is available on the Ministry's website along with the provisional subject list for NCEA Level 1. The Cabinet paper and Ministry advice have also been made public (see under the February tab). You can find the list in the engagement questionnaire, or for your ease of reference it is also accessible from this link to the Cabinet paper (go to pages 19 and 20). Please note that proposed changes will come in over the next few years and are not expected to be fully implemented until 2023.

Digital Citizenship

This week we started a new initiative with our Year 9 students looking at Digital Citizenship. Throughout the year we will run sessions with all Year 9 students during Ako time to look at various topics including:

- Digital media and your brain
- Social media and our digital footprints
- Responsible online communications
- Evaluating online news

These sessions will be run in house groups, and will include discussion activities along with short written tasks. After each session, a follow up article will be included in the school newsletter which will provide links to additional activities and discussion points that could be used at home. I would encourage each family to take the time to read through this information, and to consider how we interact with technology along with the role it plays in our lives.

In our first session, we discussed how apps and games are designed to be addictive and briefly discussed the digital wellbeing offerings available for both Android and iOS. I would encourage you to explore the features available and see if there are some aspects that could be beneficial for your family. These systems allow users to track key metrics on their phone, set individual app time limits, activate focus mode to limit distractions. and implement wind down which helps users switch off at night. Common Sense Education has these five tips to help young people balance their digital lives:

- Create screen-free times and zones
- Explore built in digital wellbeing tools (Android, iOS)
- Model behaviour you want to see
- Help kids identify healthy behaviours
- Understand how tech companies make money

These tips are explained in more detail here, and you can find an additional family activity here.




All Shook Up - WHS Musical 2020


