Principal's Message

Kia ora and welcome to the Wakatipu High School newsletter as we reach the halfway point of the term. The first two days of the week were a continuation of senior exams. It did appear that the majority of our senior students took the exams really seriously - which was great to see, here's hoping that translates into good results.

Remote Junior Next Steps on Tuesday went very well - a big thanks to everyone for their flexibility, and for engaging to support your student's education.

A highlight of the week was the annual staff vs students basketball game yesterday. The staff team was outstanding, however the game did end up being a pretty close at the end which made for an exciting finish - a great event as always:).

Covid-19 - while schools largely operate as usual in Level 2, extracurricular activities and events are more challenging. This week several events, including University visits, have been cancelled and we have spent a lot of time looking ahead re other key events - particularly the upcoming Winter Tournament week. At this stage a number of sports are going ahead in Level 2, albeit with rules and restrictions, including a number with no spectators. We do hope that these tournaments are able to proceed. Two other key events which we have been looking ahead for are the musical and the formal - neither of which are permitted to take place (in their normal form in the case of the musical) in Level 2. We will be watching developments closely and keeping our fingers crossed.

A reminder of our Covid support pages below - they are a great place to see the various support that is available through the school and community.

Literacy and reading - a reminder re how important this is for our students. This week we have begun periods of reading during Ako Time for our Year 10 students, please see below for more on this initiative and how parents can support.

As I said above, today marks the halfway point of the term. For seniors that means that they are into single-digits of weeks left - with only 9 weeks of classes now before Tutorial week and exams. Depending on what happens with Alert Levels, the second half of this term is traditionally very busy with tournament week, the musical, senior next steps, 2021 head student process, the formal, numerous other events and lots of assessment for seniors. It will be interesting to see what happens with Alert Levels - for all reasons we hope everything can go ahead as planned.

Another good newsletter below including more on the Give Time app, a great piece on 'Brainbusters' success, and a call from head student Nieve Collin for support for the netballers on monday night. The final word from me today is re students' pride in WHS. While there are times when we do wonder about this, recently we have been meeting with small groups of students about various things and one thing that came out of this is that our students are proud of WHS. This was supported by our annual student voice survey in which 89% of our students reported that they were 'proud to be at this school' - a great result.

No piece from me next Friday as I'm away. A reasonable weekend of weather ahead - nothing like last weekend's stunner, but Saturday especially will be good for getting out and about (we need snow though, especially as spring approaches ...).

Year 10 Reading in Ako Time

Reading mileage (the amount a child reads) is a very strong indicator of reading success and academic performance. Unfortunately, there is an overall decline in the amount of reading today's teenagers do - nearly half of all 15 year olds never read for enjoyment. It is important that students are encouraged at both home and school to read regularly.

At school we have made a decision to build in silent reading into the Ako Curriculum for Year 10 students. This builds on the work the English Learning Area is doing to engage students in reading. Students will have 20 minutes of reading in Ako time per week and 20 minutes of reading during their English curriculum time per week. In order for us to be successful in engaging our students, (particularly those that do not naturally take to curling up with a book), we need parents/caregivers to talk to their child about what they are reading, remind them to be bringing their reading book to school and encourage them to spend time (at least a couple of nights per week) reading at home

Most of our students do not require a specific reading intervention. They can 'read' words on a page (decode) but they need to improve their ability to comprehend text. Increasing their reading mileage and the explicit teaching of comprehension strategies, are the best ways to improve a student's ability to comprehend texts. Teachers across the curriculum are looking at ways to increase reading opportunities in their classes and to explicitly teach comprehension strategies. This work and the 'reading for pleasure' work we are pushing for in Ako time and at home should work together to support our students improve their reading fluency and comprehension.

There are four kids in each episode and, if you make it through the first two quiz rounds, you then get to compete in a race through a big, elaborate obstacle course.

On Wednesday, I travelled to Christchurch to film my episode. Unfortunately, I can't reveal all of the details about how it went but I really enjoyed the experience as it was a lot of fun and it gave me great insight into how TV production works. "

Field Trip to Wai-whaka-ata (Lake Hayes) - The Water That Reflects

Have you ever wondered why Lake Hayes looks so polluted? A collection of Year 9 Science classes, including the cross-curricular Maths, English and Science class, decided to answer this question and many more by delving into the deep mysteries of the lake to answer inquiry questions. Our task is to investigate how we can improve Lake Hayes to ensure its sustainability in the years to come.

We went on a field trip to the lake on Thursday 13th August to run experiments in the water to test the water clarity, PH levels, Nitrate levels, and the types of invertebrate creatures that inhabit different areas of Lake Hayes; this includes the spring, the lakefront, and Mill Creek (with each class focusing on a specific area). Mill Creek is the only free running water source that enters the lake, and is one of the main contributors of the pollutants in the lake. Mill Creek, along with an underground river, carry pollutants into the lake including (but not limited to) silt, phosphates, and nitrates.

We worked with the Friends of Lake Hayes group, a Charitable Society that is working to restore the water quality at Lake Hayes through lobbying, raising public awareness and research. Chairman of the group, Mike Hanff explained the history of the lake, why it has gotten as bad as it has, and what we can do to save it with council help. Please join the Friends of Lake Hayes Facebook page to support the cause! The cross-curricular course has also been studying the Māori history and mythology of the lake and the Wakatipu Basin, with Darren Rewi coming in to talk to students about the concept of turangawaewae in the same week. We are also grateful to Simon and Alex from A3 Scientific who worked with us taking bore samples at the Lake.

Once our inquiry questions start to become a reality, you may start seeing some new things popping up around Lake Hayes, so keep an eye out! We are hoping to transform the lake into a place everyone can enjoy into the future, including the creatures that live there.

The Give Time team which consists of three Year 10 students from Wakatipu High School [Charlotte Muir, Neve Short and Lily Adams] have created a website [works an app on mobiles] that efficiently allows students to reach out to you, the organisations that need student volunteers.

- 1. Go to www.givetime.nz
- 2. Register their organisation [need to verify email address]
- Add post: tell us what you want your student volunteer to do [two paragraphs max], tell us when you need them and how often, give them a contact name, a contact email or/and number.
- 4. Wait for our administration to approve your post so it can be advertised on the results page for students to access. (Volunteer South may get in touch to get more information about your organisation or role prior to approval).
- Students can browse the mobile website and get in contact with you directly.

All students need to do is:

- 1. Go to www.givetime.nz
- 2. Browse or advance search the volunteering opportunities in our community.
- 3. Get in touch with the organisation directly to volunteer!





In this time of rapid change, if you have a student leaving WHS please let us know. This includes students leaving for work/further study and students who will be enrolling in another school.


