#### **Principal's Message**

Kia ora - welcome to the Wakatipu High School newsletter as we move into spring (despite the very wintery snow this week).

There have been a number of big things going on this week, and one of the most notable has been Winter Tournament week. Big picture we do need to be thankful that most of the sports were able to proceed in Alert Level 2. Unfortunately for a number of sports that meant there were few or no spectators permitted so, while it had been my intention to attend several sports on Tuesday and Wednesday that did not happen. It sounds like our students competed and represented the school very well, and there were some great results please see the Sports section below for more.

The other big event this week has been Pride Week, with a range of events organised by our Whanaungatanga Committee, including a mufti day and the signing of the Pride Pledge today. One of WHS's key values is inclusion, and an important part of the week is trying to make sure WHS is a place where all of our students and staff feel included, accepted and safe. Our school Musical, All Shook Up, has begun to really build towards the crescendo of opening night next week. Trying to sort out what was in and out of bounds in Level 2 has been a challenge, but the three-night season next week is our best shot in terms of showcasing our students' talents to a range of audiences in Covid times. It is going to be an awesome show so please see below for how and when you can come along (NB there are only 30 seats left to the Family's show on Thursday night!).

In terms of Covid-impacted events, next week we will make a decision on the formal, which can only go ahead if we are in Level 1.

As with so many in the Wakatipu, Covid has had an impact on WHS this year - from the lockdown to extracurricular activities and wellbeing, and also financially. Like many NZ secondary schools, we normally have International (fee-paying) students who make an important financial contribution to the school. With the borders being closed - both now and into the future, this important source of revenue has been impacted. While we know that there are families who are struggling - and our Awhi Fund is for people who need financial support, we would ask that those who are able to please pay our school Donation and Voluntary Fees as this income does allow us to deliver the great all-round education that we want for our students. It really does make a difference - many thanks in anticipation to those who are able.

Senior Next Steps are coming on Wednesday 16th - see below for more.

As you know this term we have been trialing a shortened Break 3 and an earlier finish to the school day. We are currently surveying students and staff and will make a decision on this soon.

Change is coming to our communications, including the newsletter. This will start with next week's newsletter - which will come to you by email same as always, but it will have a new format and feel and some great new features. It will also introduce our awesome new App - but more on that next week.

Another big week, with only three weeks to go now in the term - and lots to happen in that time. A pretty reasonable first weekend of spring weather ahead, tomorrow will be the best for outdoor activities (and fingers crossed for a little more snow on the hills this evening :).

#### **Senior Next Steps**



#### ALL SHOOK UP But The Show Must Go On!

The WHS Musical is all go and the students are working as hard as ever to ensure that this year's performance of All Shook Up is the success it deserves to be.

However, there is no doubt that the COVID situation is making it challenging in terms of how the show will proceed. The plan is to carry on as though we will be in Level 2 next week with the following shows in place.

**Thursday 10 September:** Live performance for parents and caregivers of the cast and band starting at 7.30pm (this does not include musical crew families). A total of 100 patrons are allowed under Level 2 restrictions. Tickets will be limited to 2 per family. We will request updated contact details for contact tracing. Should there be tickets left over, access will be on a first in, first served basis. This will be communicated via the school Facebook page. Tickets for both live performances will be sold through the school office at the main reception from Thursday 3 September. There will be no door sales at Level 2.

Live performance ticket cost: \$30 per adult \$15 per student (Eftpos or cash acceptable) (No service charges will be applied)

Ticket cost will be \$20 for the Live Stream plus any service charge from Eventbrite. Total audience capacity is 350 to comply with show rights which equates to our house capacity.

We're getting in touch to let you know that the new bus card, the Bee Card, will replace the GoCard and will be used from 15th September on Queenstown's Orbus network.

We know some of your students catch an Orbus to and from school and we want to make sure they are ready.

Children 5-18 years old are eligible for cheaper youth fares with the Bee Card. It's \$1.50 for any trip across the network in Queenstown using a Bee Card. A cash fare (without a Bee Card) is \$4 for any trip.


