40 HOUR FAMINE



This week, the 40 Hour Famine Committee have been running activities around school as part of our 'Awareness Week', aimed at making students aware of the 40 Hour Famine and the impact it has on refugees like the South Sudanese children - with particular reference to how our students can maximise their involvement this year. As part of this, we have run an introduction session on the famine where students participated in an online refugee simulation 'Two Billion Miles', a sausage sizzle and bake sale event, heard from World Vision speaker Harley Hamilton and held an Adventure Race emulating a refugee journey as an unofficial house competition. It has been an amazing week which we hope has really increased the knowledge of WHS students on the famine and hopefully encouraged some to sign up and support this year's famine effort!

With this in mind, this weekend running from the 8th -10th of June is the 40 Hour Famine itself. This year, it is in support of the South Sudanese Refugee Crisis - a country with a history of war conflict that has only intensified in the last few years to see 2 million of its 13 million population fleeing to the safety of World Vision's Ugandan Refugee camps. The children of South Sudan need your help. Giving up something for 40 hours of your life may seem too simplistic, but the money you raise from it will directly benefit someone else's life forever. 
