Fundraising

As well as increasing revenue for the school, fundraising provides many benefits including:

- providing valuable experience and training for students
- involving students in community service
- encouraging students to value equipment they helped provide
- involving parents in school life
- giving the community a sense of involvement with the school.

No member of the board or any fundraising committee, or any person associated with fundraising at Wakatipu High School, may receive benefits (e.g. preferential treatment or income) from fundraising, other than reimbursement of approved expenses.

The following guidelines apply to fundraising at Wakatipu High School:

- Fundraising by any individual or group either within the school or external to it must be pre-approved by the principal, and money raised should be spent for the approved purpose.
- If the school is unable to spend the money for the approved purpose, where possible, the money is spent in a way that is consistent with the original reason for raising the money.
- Fundraising activities are recorded and monitored through our usual financial management systems.
- Fundraising activities involving food meet food safety requirements.
- It is illegal to offer alcohol as a prize for certain gambling activities, such as raffles.
