Principal's Message

Kia ora and welcome to the Wakatipu High School newsletter at the start of Term 2! This term is always a very busy term at WHS, including for extra and co-curricular activities such as the Formal, House competitions including debating and Matatu (Haka-waiata), senior subject and University trips amongst many other things ... and it is also a very important term for teaching and learning! The term has begun well, and we look forward to that continuing.

2018 Results - you may recall that the MoE changed their method of counting results from last year and we have been waiting for the official results to be released, which they now finally have been. We are really pleased with how we have done, including:

- NCEA Level 2 92%
- University Entrance 63%
- NCEA Level 2 with Excellence 23%
- · NCEA Level 1 with Endorsement 54%
- · Scholarships 14

Our aim last year was to do a great job of moving into the new school and maintaining our great all-round education - and these results show just how well this went (with all of these results being above, at or very close to our targets for the year). My congratulations to all students who worked hard throughout the year to achieve their academic goals, and to staff who worked so hard last year to support them to achieve.

School Fees and Donations - you may recall that school fees have been reduced this year and a number of them have become voluntary. Our sincere thanks to those who have paid these, as these funds really do make a difference to our ability to offer a great all-round education. Similarly, the school donation - which is voluntary, also makes a real difference and we would ask that people please do pay these if they are able.

Board of Trustees Elections - a reminder that nominations for those wishing to stand in the upcoming elections close next Friday, 10 May.

Excellence & Ad Alta Assemblies - are held in Houses, and are coming up in Week 3. These are very important celebrations of student effort and achievement, and this year will also feature the new junior Akonga Passport. Parents are welcome to attend, and prizewinners parents will be emailed next week.

Uniform Reminder

A reminder to students and parents about wearing the uniform correctly over the winter months.

For girls (NB: unless stated otherwise, these rules apply year-round):

- · The blue skirt or blue kilt may be worn.
- The blue kilt must be worn with navy tights or navy knee high socks (not ankle socks).
- The blue skirt must be worn with the navy ankle socks (not tights or knee high socks).
- 2019 is the last year of our phasing out of the old school uniform. This means that in Terms 2 & 3 only, Y13 girls only may wear the old green kilt, with navy tights or knee high socks.
- Girls may also wear school shorts or trousers. NB trousers must be worn without any modification (including cuffing or cropping) other than hemming them so that they sit just above the sole of the school shoes.
- · Only ankle socks may be worn with shorts.

For boys there are no changes to the uniform, although a reminder that they must wear a plain black belt with their shorts or trousers.

General uniform reminders:

- All students must wear the school tie, except Y13 students who wear the 2019 Y13 tie.
- The blazer is the compulsory uniform item, and the jersey or vest may be worn as a secondary item (hoodies are not permitted at any time other than during PE lessons).
- Plain black Puffer jackets may be worn in June, July and August only.
- Shoes have a separate set of requirements which are outlined on the school uniform page of our school website (link below).

Karate - Australian Open

Swimming - NZ National Age Group Championships

In the school holidays Isaak Frewen attended the NZ National Age Group Championships in Wellington. He was the only swimmer from Queenstown who qualified, as times were really tight. Because of this Isaak had to fundraise for himself and his coach to attend.

Isaak swam extremely well, achieving some personal best times and qualifying in 8 events. His top 3 placings were 5th in 50m Fly, 12th 200m Fly and 13th 400m Individual Medley. Well done Isaak.



Brooklyn has been nominated to compete with 130 elite young performing solos artists, aged between 15 and 25 yrs from all over New Zealand at the National Young Performer Awards, 18 October 2019 hosted by Performing Arts Competitions Association of NZ (PACANZ).

This years' event is for Troupes and Soloists in Modern Dance, Highland Dance, Instrumental and Speech & Drama. This elite solo competition starts with preliminary rounds, building to the Sunday semi-finals and the spectacular Sunday night finals concert featuring 15 of the best competing for \$40,000 in prize money. Each Troupe and Solo performer represents a PACANZ member society, and undergoes a rigorous selection process. It is an honour for young performing artists to be selected to participate at a national award.

Sailing - South Island Sailing Champs

Over the holidays Aidan Gordon competed in the South Island Sailing Champs in Te Anau. In the Laser Radial event Aidan placed 6th overall out of 6 laser full rigs and 7 laser radials. Out of the radials which Aidan sails, he placed 2nd. Aidan's next regatta is on July 6th -7th at the Manly Sailing Club in Auckland for Mid Winter Champs.

Adventure Racing - Arrow 6+6 Adventure Race





Ken Zemke is an Emmy Award winning editor and film maker. The TV series he produces has run for 16 years and it's called "Baha'i on Air".




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

NEW WHEELIE BINS DELIVERED TO QUEENSTOWN SOON

From 1 July, our district is switching to a three wheelie bin system for recycling and rubbish. All Queenstown residents eligible for kerbside collections will receive three new wheelie bins in a staged rollout:

Arthur's Point, Wakatipu Basin, Lake Hayes Estate, Shotover Country	mid – late April	
Frankton, Frankton Rd, Fernhill, Quail Rise, Kelvin Heights, Jack's Point & Hanley's Farm	early May	
Queenstown Hill & CBD	early June	



Glenorchy, Kingston, Arrowtown and Gibbston residents should already have their bins. If you didn't get yours, call QLDC on 03 441 0499.

When your bins arrive:

- · check that the street number on the bins matches your house.
- Your bin is tagged to your place.
- help out any absentee neighbours by taking their bins off the street.



Fairness, Transparency and Our Right to Government Information


The tagline of the independent Ombudsman Office is "fairness for all". It is the official entity that handles complaints about and investigates state sector agencies, administers the Official Information Act and protects citizens' rights through activities like monitoring prisons and implementing the UN disabilities convention.

Aimee Bryant is a principal advisor to the Chief Ombudsman and she will discuss her office's role in ensuring fairness, transparency and the fundamental right of citizens to access government information. She will cover topical issues plus trends she has seen on these fronts during her five years in the office. And how best to get information from perhaps reluctant officials.
