
The National Library states that the habit of reading, widely, into teenage years helps students to:

Homestay Hosts - Short term, Term 4 and long term for 2020

We are currently looking for homestay hosts to host our international students for both short term and long term hosting. Short term could be a stay of 2-5 nights, or a stay of 4-6 weeks. Long term would be a minimum of 6 months from 2020. Depending on the length of the stay, you would be paid a nightly or weekly rate. Our current rates are \$290 per week (all inclusive), and this will be increased to \$310 per week (all inclusive) from 2020.

The hosting requirements are:

- Any person in your household over the age of 18 will need to complete the police vet process.
- A student will require their own bedroom (that is sufficiently heated over winter) with a student desk (or somewhere appropriate that they
- can complete their homework).
- To provide 3 meals a day (breakfast, lunch and dinner) along with a few snacks.
- To offer to include them in your day to day family life.
- To assist with their washing if needed.
- To provide a warm and safe environment to live in during their stay with you.

2019/2020 Aspen Exchange Trip

Due to unexpected circumstances, one spot has recently opened up on the 2019/2020 Aspen Exchange Trip for this upcoming January (2020), and we are giving Year 11 and 12s the opportunity to apply.

On the trip we will be visiting Aspen, San Francisco, and Denver. While in Aspen, you will stay with a host family for 11 nights and be attending activities in the daytime with the WHS group. On the weekends students will also be given the opportunity to ski, where passes and rental gear will be provided. During our time in Denver and San Fran we will be going to a NHL ice hockey game, visiting Alcatraz Island, and biking the Golden Gate Bridge among other activities.

The cost of the trip is aprox. \$7000.00. This includes flights, accomodation, insurance, travel expenses, baggage costs, activities, and food. Cost are subject to change as we finalise the price of altering the airline tickets. This is a high expense trip, and must be supported by your parents and/or guardians. An initial deposit of \$2500 will need to be paid immediately in order to book flights.

You won't work in the rain and the day would be postponed in the event of rain. If anyone has hay fever/grass allergies they are advised to take an antihistamine as it will be hayfever season. The employer will provide a site safety induction, morning tea, gloves, high visibility vests.
