Junior Next Steps

Once again our upcoming Junior Next Steps meetings will comprise a 20 minute meeting with students, parents and Kaiārahi. They are on Tuesday 13 August from 2.30 - 6.00pm.

The discussion will centre around the students' goals, their learning engagement, progress and achievement, and course selection for 2020, including future pathways. These meetings will be held in the spaces the students have their Ako time.

School will finish at 1.50pm but buses will only be running at the normal time of 3.30pm. Students need to make alternative arrangements if they plan to leave school at 1.50pm. Students are welcome to use the library and gymnasium while they wait for their scheduled meeting time or buses.

Senior Exams

Senior Exams are being held from Thursday 8 August to Tuesday 13 August. The timetable has been finalised and sent out to all students. Students should be at school at least 20 minutes prior to their exam.

Students should now be preparing a plan and begin their study. School exams are important for a number of reasons, including for students to practice the art of performing well in an exam environment, and they are used for 'derived grades' for the number of students who are always unable to sit external exams at the end of the year due to illness, injury, accident etc. Additionally, these results are used to determine end of year prizes.



Could New Zealand Provide Global Leadership?

Can our small Pacific nation have an impact on global issues? And if so – how, in what areas and based on what values or principles?

These are some of the questions we will discuss as part of a community workshop co-hosted by Catalyst Trust and independent think tank, the New Zealand Alternative this coming Wednesday, August 7. It's a chance to have an informed discussion about meaty issues that matter.



"There is a pressing need for progressive leadership on many fronts in the world and we believe New Zealand could provide it," says NZA co-director Thomas Nash, who led the global campaign to ban cluster bombs and served on the board of the Nobel Prizewinning International Campaign to Abolish Nuclear Weapons.

"Or should we just determine our foreign policy in terms of support for allies and its impact on trade?"

Catalyst Trust's August 7 workshop is part of a nationwide conversation NZA will lead on how we could

contribute to our quickly changing and interconnected world. Queenstown community's input will be included in the framing of multiple policy papers due out by the end of the year.




