Different workshops are available for different interests and age groups from Years 1 - 13

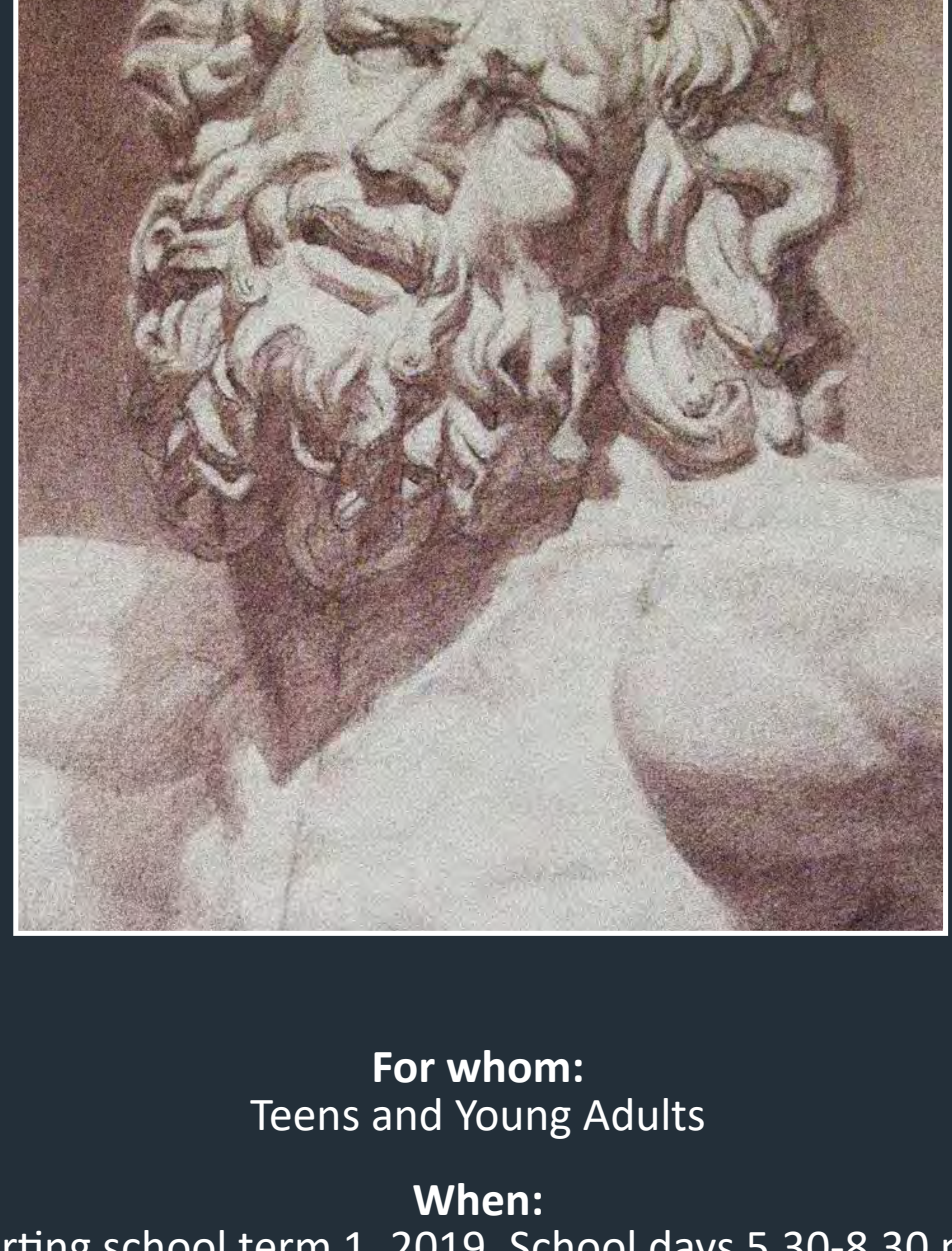

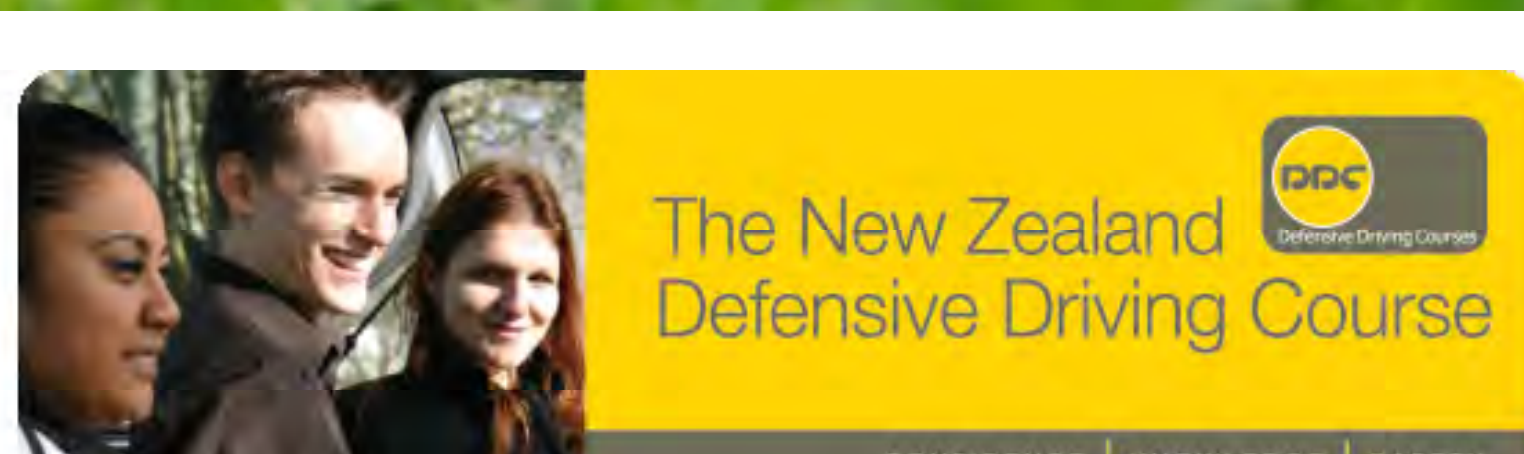

Successful completion of the theory and practical components goes part way to completing Unit Standards 3464 and 3465. It also takes six months off the time required on a Restricted Licence.
