Principal's Message

Kia ora - as always at this time of year, Wakatipu High School is very busy right now. There are only three school days for seniors until senior prizegiving next Friday, followed by Tutorial Week and then exams - which start in two weeks. As well as the focus on finishing studies and preparing for exams, it is also a time of year when we celebrate, recognise and reward students.

We have also been doing that this week with our final Excellence and Ad Alta Assemblies in the Houses. It is great to see many students receiving recognition for their efforts and achievements, and to be awarding junior students for their all-round effort and engagement in the Ākonga Passport (lists of recipients will be in next week's newsletter). Speaking of which, AJ Hackett Bungy have been incredible supporters of this programme this year, and this week they presented prizes for the t-shirt design competition totalling \$1000, with \$500 going to winner Molly Richards. As you will see below, AJ Hackett Bungy's annual Year 13 Leavers' bungy jump was last weekend - another amazing example of their very generous support of WHS and our students.

At the assemblies this week I spoke about the tertiary Scholarships that our departing Year 13s have gained - which currently toal over \$367,000! As I noted to other students, this is absolutely amazing and what can be gained with a great academic and all-round education.

Also at the assemblies this week the 2020 House Leaders were announced, see below for the list, congratulations again to them.

Speechfest was also on Wednesday night this week. Both the junior and senior speakers were amazing, with remarkably varied and challenging topics, from sociopaths to capitalism and 'what does it mean to be a man?' and everything in between.

Discipline - following last week's newsletter, we did in fact have the drug detection dog through the school yesterday. We have had positive feedback regarding this initiative and it is something that we will do on a more regular basis in the future, but please note that we will not provide prior notice again.

Senior Prizegiving - is our most formal ceremony of the year, and is next Friday afternoon. Before School and After School Drop Off

A reminder to all parents that Red Oaks Drive, outside of WHS, is a no-stopping zone and vehicles are not permitted to stop in bus stops, cycle lanes or on dotted yellow lines. We are increasingly concerned about the safety of our students as vehicles pull out into traffic, perform U-Turns or block the bus area whilst students are crossing the road as they arrive and depart school each morning. It is disappointing to hear that the QLDC staff monitoring the area have been subjected to abuse by both parents and students. Please take this opportunity to talk to students about responsible driving behaviour, and set a good example by complying with road regulations.

Parents picking up students after school are also reminded that they should not be parking in the car parking spaces at the back of Remarkables House whilst waiting to collect their children. These spaces belong to, and are paid for by the tenants in the building. The school has received repeated feedback (and photos) of parents using these parking spots. Parents wishing to avoid traffic within the school perimeter are encouraged to meet their children in the public car park on Hawthorne Drive which is 250m from the school and has free parking for 2 hours.

Year 13 Bungy




Lockers
