# **Principal's Message**

Kia ora and welcome to the Wakatipu High School newsletter - which is somewhat out of sync at the moment.

As per our communications, we have been mourning the loss of our wonderful teacher, Mrs Kate Moetaua, who passed away last Friday. Kate was a very special person and educator who touched the lives of so many students in her work as drama teacher - both in out of class, including the Musicals, Sheilah Winn Shakespeare and One Act Plays, and as a previous Dean of Mackenzie House. Kate was passionate and incredibly dedicated, as well as being remarkable in her ability to engage, empower and impact students. Staff and students, past and present, are deeply saddened by her loss and our thoughts are with her family and friends. Kate's funeral is 1pm Friday at Moonlight Stables, and accordingly the school day on Friday has been altered - for a complete summary please see below.

# Student Focus - Bianca Crichton

The subject of our third Youthmark Award Recipient *Student Focus* feature has achieved an incredible array of honours during her time at WHS. From academic excellence in the classroom, to student leadership, to extra-curricular activities, she has more than earned every distinction. Now also with the accolade of 2018 Dux of Wakatipu High School - Bianca Crichton.

Even as a Year 9, Bianca was focussed. "I started high school quite ambitious," she says, "and throughout I've set quite high goals for myself. I really wanted to be Head Girl, so as time has gone on I've been really happy to achieve those goals."



"It's an honour," she says of her Youthmark win. "I remember seeing photos of former winners, and I'd read about them... It's very cool to think that that's me now."

The Youthmark is in a substantial list of awards she's received this year. As well as being 2018's Head Girl, acting in many other leadership roles and achieving Dux, she also received the Queenstown Volunteer Fire Brigade Trophy for Best All Round Student in Year 13 and the Lieutenant Colonel R E Romans Award for Outstanding Leadership at this year's senior prizegiving. Recently, too, she was presented the Otago University Academic Excellence Scholarship, worth \$35,000.

Outside of school, Bianca is also a talented dancer, studying Advanced 1 Classical Ballet Syllabus in 2017 and Advanced 2 Classical Ballet Syllabus in 2018. She also works as a volunteer in St John's Youth Cadets, representing the programme at Regional Championships, and was instrumental in organising this year's Pride Week to celebrate the rainbow community, along with 'Pink Shirt Day', which raised awareness of bullying and the effects that it can have on young people. Across the board, she's made an enormous contribution upon every activity she has embarked.

"Science, all the way," she says of her potential future. "For quite a while I wanted to be a doctor, but now I'm not so sure - I'm debating whether I want to be a doctor or do neuroscience and psychology, if I get in. Neuroscience would be more research- based, but hopefully I could still do the clinical side with St John."

For now, however, she plans to take a well-earned break from studying, taking a gap year of travelling in 2019, before heading to Otago University in 2020.

In her remarkable valedictory speech at Senior Prizegiving, Bianca articulated the pressures sometimes associated with achievement, and reminded her fellow students to enjoy their time at school. She repeated the mantra "I am enough" during her speech, revealing an emotional and erudite wisdom well beyond her 17 years. It's clear she's destined to continue setting such an incredible standard.

Enviroschools is an action-based education programme where young people plan, design and implement sustainability projects and become catalysts for change in their families and within the wider New Zealand community. Enviroschools engages with children, young people and their communities through the formal education system of early childhood education (ECE) centers, primary and secondary schools.

Each school's journey is unique and usually develops from small beginnings, gaining strength and depth over time. Ongoing reflection is an essential part of the Enviroschools journey, and there are three 'reflection stages' – Bronze, Silver and Green-Gold.

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

This is a game not to be missed!

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
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
